THE CHADBOURN BELL



The Chadbourn Bell symbolizes Southeastern Community College's enduring legacy and unity for Columbus County. Gifted to SCC by the Columbus County Board of Education, this historic artifact has been a part of our community's narrative since 1924, initially serving the old Chadbourn High School before finding its home at SCC. In a meaningful ceremony in August 1980, the bell was dedicated on our campus, honoring Arthur W. Williamson, Sr., whose generous donation of land facilitated our campus expansion. The bell's importance goes beyond its physical presence; it represents the connection, history, and continuous progress of SCC and our community.

As SCC celebrates its 60th anniversary, the college is excited about the future and the Chadbourn Bell's role in symbolizing our shared history and aspirations. To celebrate 60 years at SCC, our Foundation's "Raise the Bell" campaign aims to elevate the bell's significance further, creating a lasting legacy through engraved brick walkways that will surround the bell, allowing

the community to leave a personal mark on SCC's history.

The initiative to engrave bricks as part of the "Raise the Bell" campaign offers a unique opportunity for individuals to contribute to SCC's history and the new structure that will house the bell. This effort supports campus enhancements and fortifies the bond between SCC and the community, ensuring that the Chadbourn Bell continues to resonate with future generations. As SCC looks forward to new chapters in its history, the Chadbourn Bell remains a symbol of our commitment to education, community engagement, and progress, reminding us of the powerful legacy we carry forward together.

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Originally conceived as a medieval weapon, the mace transitioned into an emblem of academic integrity and the right of institutions to confer degrees, a tradition dating back to the University of Vienna in 1385. Southeastern Community College introduced its mace during its 40th anniversary, crafted from the wood of a crepe myrtle tree native to our campus. It symbolizes the institution’s deep roots in the community and dedication to growth and enlightenment. This original mace featured the college seal encased in a brass flame, representing knowledge and community warmth.

In 2023, in alignment with the college’s re-branding, a new mace was introduced under the guidance of President Chris English. Maintaining the cherished wood aesthetic of its predecessor to signify continuity and respect for tradition, the new mace also showcases the updated college seal and our refreshed vision and commitment to innovation. This updated emblem is a testament to our college’s journey towards integrating academic excellence

and technical proficiency, ensuring a seamless pathway for student success.

The Southeastern Community College mace embodies our legacy and aspirations, symbolizes the resilience and natural beauty of our surroundings, and displays our commitment as a central pillar of support and empowerment for our community.
